School Plan

- Processes – ensuring our systems work properly to deliver improvement.
- Products – achievement of the outcomes we are seeking.
- Practices – the embedded processes that will enable us to sustain our improvements.

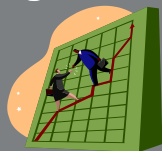

Please remember that all payments must be cash or cheque only.

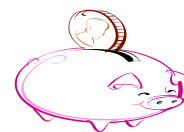
The shops opening hours are Tuesdays and Thursdays from 8.30am to 9am and 2.30pm to 3pm.

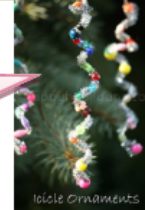

- **Thursday activities:** Lots of last minute Christmas crafts and presents to make and wrap. Make a hot chocolate spoon to stir through your hot chocolate on Christmas Day.
- **Friday activities:** Lots of last minute Christmas crafts and presents to make and wrap. Make a Snowman using a white sock, buttons and scrap Christmas material. Let's make some Peppermint Crunch/Milk Chocolate Chip Cookies.
- **Monday activities:** Winter Wonderland. Make your own snow, feel how cold it is and take it home in a jar. Make a crystal snow flake using borax. Make some Jelly Belly Biscuits.
- **Tuesday activities:** Make a Tea Light Candle Holder using a balloon and Christmas coloured wax. Make a sweet Christmas tree using waffle cone, green icing, smarties and some imagination. Make a tin embossed candle holder.
