Overview of Student Welfare Policy

- All students will start each school year on *Green Level*
- All students have a behaviour card. These are kept on the teacher's desk in a box. The box will go with the class to Library and RFF.
- As students receive any awards including Star, Merit, Banners etc or demonstrate positive behaviour these will be recorded on their behaviour card.
- As students misbehave or demonstrate negative behaviour that is not in accordance with class and school expectations this will be recorded on their behaviour card and they will go down to Level 1, 2, 3, or 4.
- When a student is moved up or down a level this will be recorded on their card and highlighted.
- ALL teachers can write on ALL student cards.
- As teachers write on student's cards they will send them to the supervisor if they notice a series of negative comments.
- Term 1 students need to maintain *Green level*. If this is achieved without dropping a level they will be invited to attend a reward day at the end of the term.
- From the beginning of Term 2 teachers will review all student behaviour on a fortnightly basis. Those students with predominately positive comments may progress to *Bronze level*. Their names will be published in the school newsletter.
- This fortnightly monitoring of behaviour will continue to occur on a fortnightly basis to fit in with the schedule of school newsletters.
- From the beginning of Term 3 students with predominately positive comments can progress to *Silver level*. Their names will be published in the school newsletter.
- From the beginning of Term 4 students with positive comments can progress to *Gold level*.
- There will be Reward days at the end of each term. Any child that has maintained only positive levels across the term and has not dropped to a level 1, 2, 3 or 4 in that term will be invited to attend.
- Towards the end of Term 4 there will be *Gold reward day* for those students that have reached *Gold level*.
- Each teacher is encouraged to have a visual display in their classroom with student's names that are on positive levels. (*Bronze, Silver, Gold*)

STUDENTS RIGHTS and RESPONSIBILITIES

I have a responsibility to attend school regularly, be punctual and wear my uniform.

I have a responsibility to be honest.

I have a responsibility to keep my school neat, clean and tidy and to move through the school grounds in an orderly manner.

I have a responsibility to act sensibly in and out of school.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You have been placed at this level because your behaviour is INAPPROPRIATE <p>and / or</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You do not always co-operate and occasionally cause problems in class or within the school grounds. <p>and /or</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Your class teachers and / or other teachers are concerned by your behaviour. <p>and/or</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You are probably doing ONE or MORE of these things: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - not attempting to do your work to the best of your ability - trying to disrupt or upset the class which means others cannot get their work done - being rude to your teacher - being unruly in the playground. <p>and /or</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> It has been necessary for the class teacher to send you to the Stage Supervisor. <p>and /or</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You have received two (2) or more negative comments on your behaviour card. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will be placed on this level by your Stage Supervisor.
